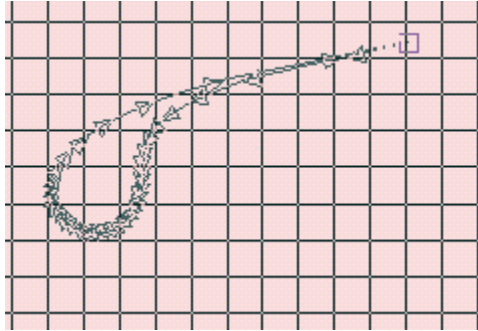


THRED GAME 1

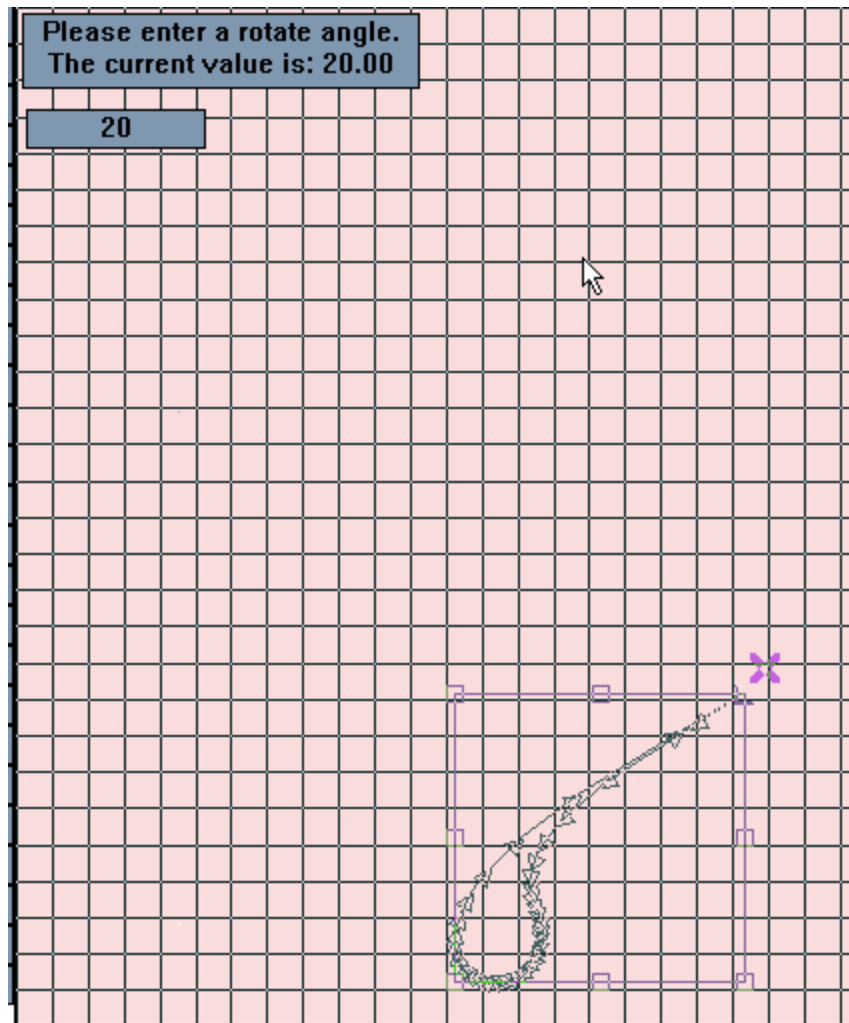
Try this:

Make a Default Paisley Tear form but change the points to 36 from 24.



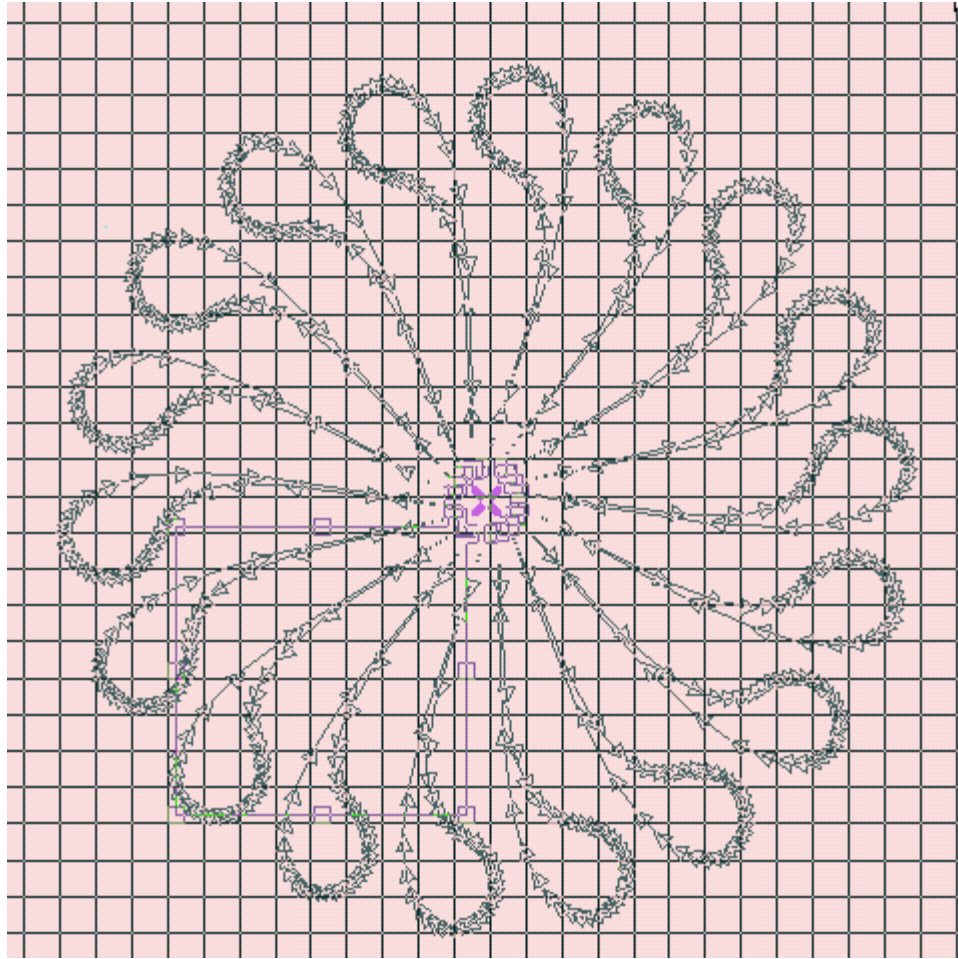
Don't fill the form. Make a mark at the pointed end of the tear shape (M). Select the form.

Go to Edit - Rotate - Command - 20 – Enter

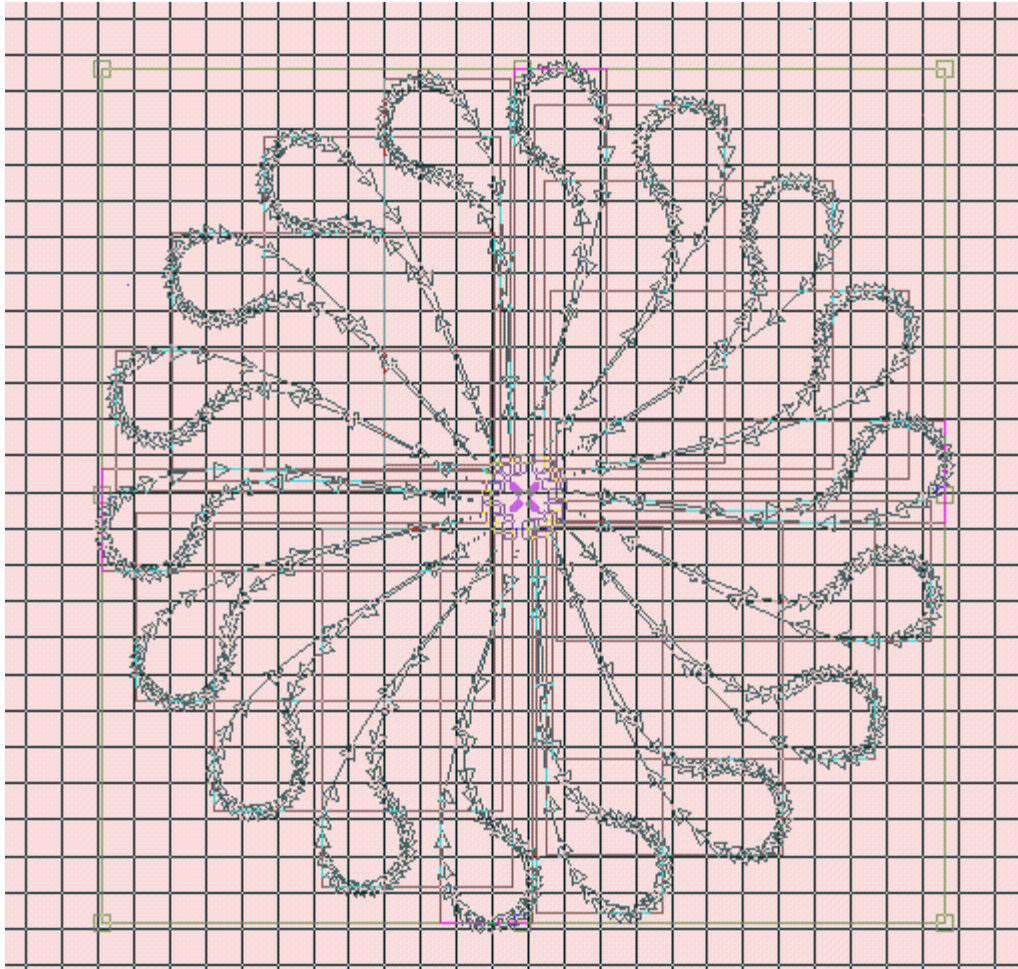


Next hold down the Shift Key + Page Up key and form a circle of tears around the Mark.

You should have a neat circle of tears $(18) = 360$ divided by 20.(The rotate command number).



Go to - box select - bottom of colour palette. Click on it. A cross cursor will appear. Start at the top left corner and drag a square around all the tears. All the tear forms are now selected.



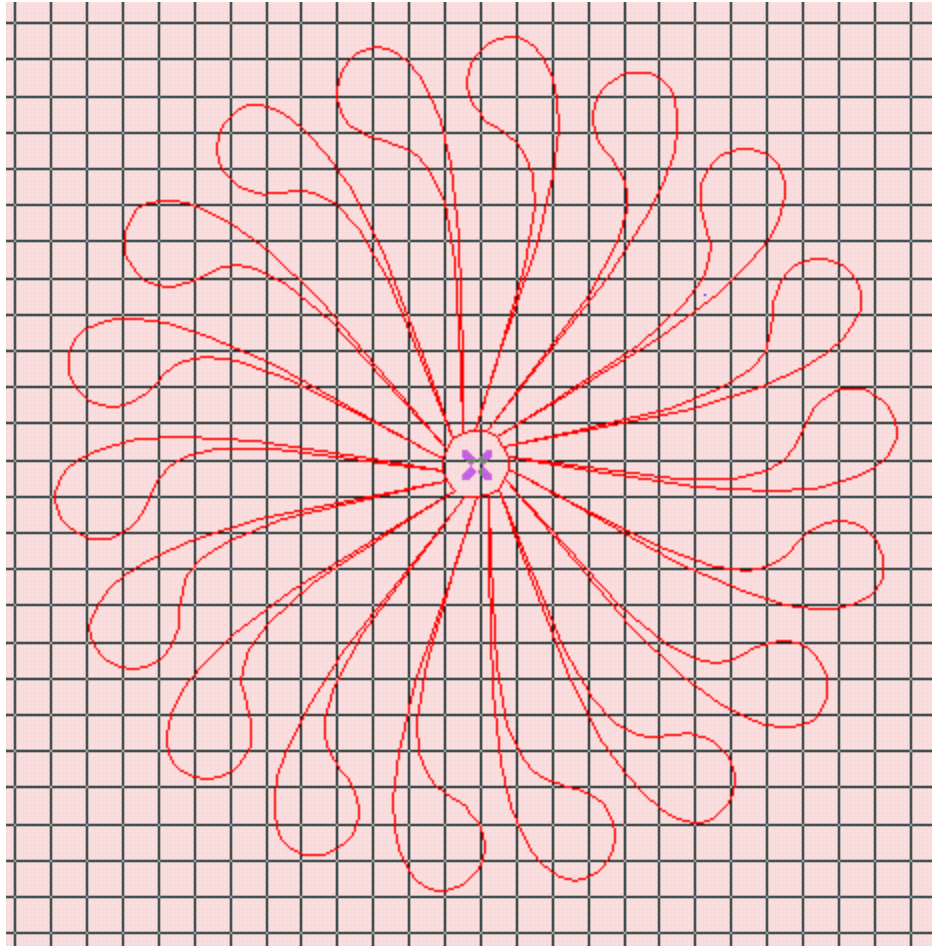
Go to - Fill - Border – double.

Hit Esc to turn off all the form-forms.

Now turn off the individual forms on the top menu. (frm+)

You have a circle of stitches for quilting.

By using different form shapes you can make some interesting quilting designs.
